

## **theBOGG CAMP EXPECTATIONS (*THE RULES!*)**

Everyone is expected to set an example in speech, in love and in life (I Tim 4:12)

1. All Campers and Sponsors are to attend all activities of the week.
2. All campers are expected to reflect a Christian example by their dress and actions. Adult Sponsors are responsible for the dress and appearance of all their campers. Immodest clothing, distasteful designs or messages, or shirts advertising improper products are not acceptable. Modest shorts are acceptable and can be worn to worship services; they should extend as long as the arm and hand of the person wearing them. Campers are asked not to wear hats to worship.
3. Swimming will only be during regularly scheduled times when lifeguards are on duty. The boys will only swim with boys and the girls only swim with the girls. Modest clothes and shoes must be worn to and from the pool.
4. There will be no use of alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, unauthorized fireworks, or any kind of firearms allowed on the campgrounds. CD and Cassette players are to be used only in preparation for Worship or the Coffee House.
5. The dorms and campgrounds are to be kept in good order throughout the week and are to be left in better shape than they were found. Shaving cream fights are prohibited. Destruction or defacing of buildings is prohibited.
6. No one is to leave the campgrounds without the permission of the camp director. "Campgrounds" is defined as the open area of camp where there are buildings, lights and activities. If permission is granted to leave the campgrounds, camper(s) must then be accompanied by an adult sponsor.
7. Campers are not to be in their dorms unsupervised. Girls are not to be in the areas of the boys' dorms and boys are not to be in the areas of the girls' dorms. Campers are not allowed out of their dorms at night after lights out unless they are accompanied by an adult sponsor – and in case of an emergency.
8. Sponsors are responsible for the supervision, behavior, and dress of their campers. All sponsors will be expected to look after the welfare of all campers at all times. Sponsors are responsible for dorm activities, which include:
